What comes next ???

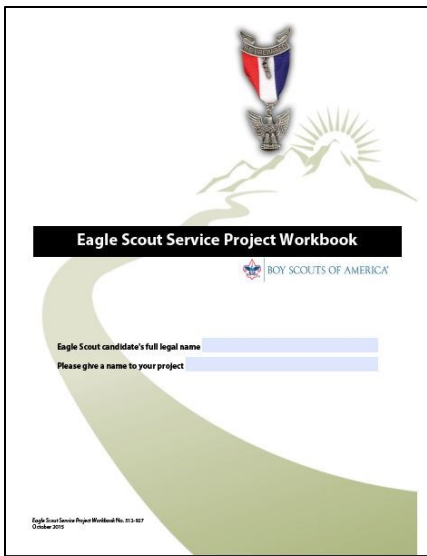


Your Scout Handbook tells you what the requirements are for reaching your next rank... Eagle Scout. The handbook does not, however, indicate the paperwork you will need to fill out as you complete those requirements. This is a brief listing of those documents. You should refer to this material as you complete your merit badges and begin to think about your Eagle Project.

For several years, Troop 18 has asked scouts to choose a Troop Eagle Advisor. This is someone you can talk to about your project, fund raising, Eagle application, ... You can talk to anyone, but the following are experienced with the process: Mr. Glenn Chaffee, Mr. Darin Noel, Mr. Peter Miles, or Mr. Mike Kensek.

- 1.) **Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook** -- This 26 page booklet is mandatory for you project documentation. Although it is a fillable pdf document, it is your choice to type into the form or to print out and fill out in pen. Neatness and detail is important in each of the sections. As the instructions state, you should read the document completely before filling out any information, and you should not fill out later sections until all the work and approvals have been completed on the prior sections. You may not start working on your project until you complete the "Project Proposal" section and have "Proposal Page E" signed with 4 signatures. Lastly, all new projects must use the October 2015 version of the document. (See document 1a – Fundraising Guidelines for additional reference information.
- 2.) **Eagle Scout Rank Application** -- This 2-sided application will contain much of your history information as well as the approval signatures as you proceed on your Eagle Trail. On the application, section "Certification by Applicant" indicates a "statement of your ambitions and life purpose...". This is sometimes overlooked, so this is a reminder...
- 3.) **Guidelines for Completing Eagle Rank Application** -- This is checklist provided by Seneca Waterways Council for your use in filling out the application.
- 4.) **Eagle Scout Reference Check Procedures** -- Instructions for requesting references required for your Eagle Board of Review. You will be requesting character references which will be reviewed during your Council BOR. The Eagle candidate, parents, and leaders are not allowed to read the references received. They must be handed in to the scout office in sealed envelopes as received.
- 5.) **Recommendation for Eagle Scout Applicant** -- This is the recommendation form that you will hand out to your references.
- 6.) **Eagle Scout Background information** -- Two forms are handed out before your Council Eagle BOR. They are the "Eagle Scout Biography" and "Eagle Scout Media Information". It is best to spend some time preparing what you want to write on these forms. This is your chance to impress those reading your info about yourself and your project. This will be used for newspaper submissions as well as for Eagle Project of the Month selection.

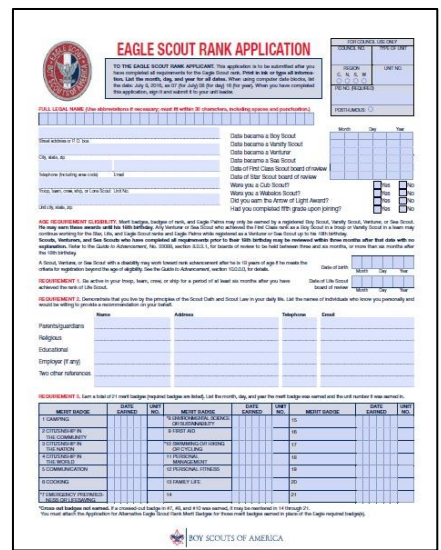

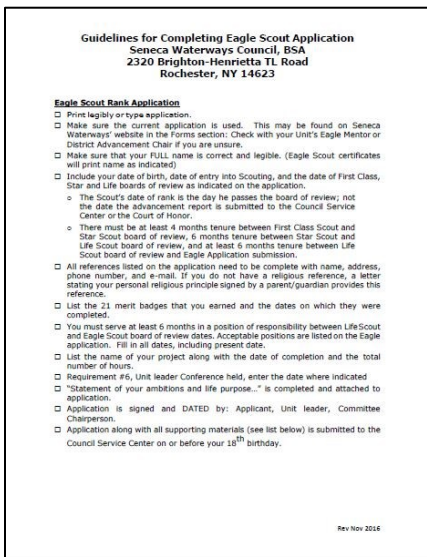
1 – Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook



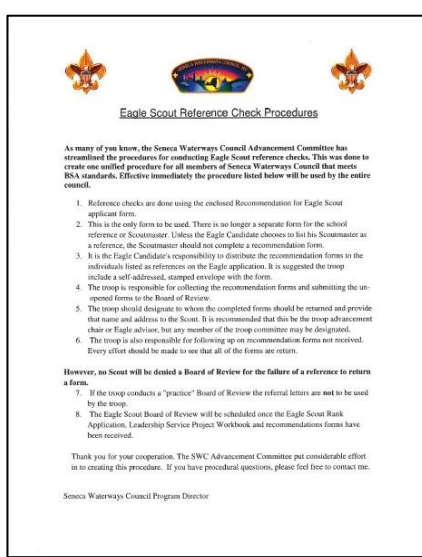

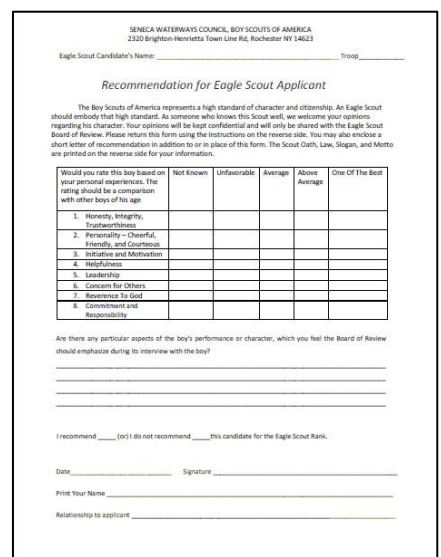

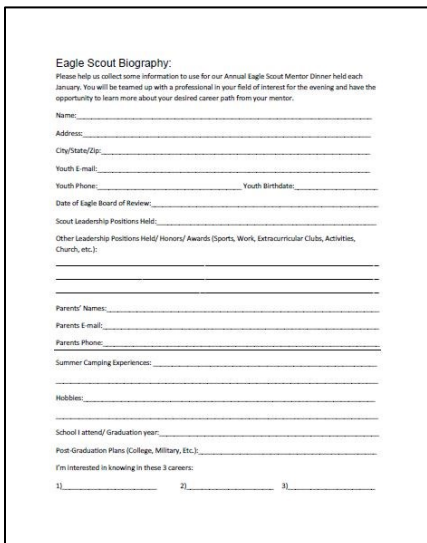
